Dr. Haas has accepted the award for their overall winning abstract at the 11th Annual International Medical Simulation in Healthcare Conference held in New Orleans in January. The research abstract titled "Physiologic Stress Levels during Simulated and Actual Anesthesia Administration by Student Nurse Anesthetists" also won the "Human Factors" category. The abstract was selected from over 700 abstracts accepted at this year's conference. This conference attracts more than 2,700 attendees representing 44 countries. The research team led by Dr. Haas included Duane Patterson, Professor Lowe, Professor Burtnett, Dr. Nater (Univ of Zurich), and Dr. Arbittier.

### **AANA Mid-Year Assembly**

Senior students, Marci Baity, Sarah Canero, and Tony Frank, along with clinical coordinator George Haritos, CRNA and YCP alumnus Ashley Fedan were thrilled to attend the annual American Association of Nurse Anesthetists (AANA) Mid Year Assembly in Washington, D.C. The conference was filled with lectures regarding current legislative issues such as provider non-discrimination and supervisory opt-out. They also discussed the continued issue of strengthening and maintaining Title 8 nurse education funding. In addition, there was continued discussion regarding the reversal of Medicare anesthesia cuts in an attempt to

We also had the chance to practice neuraxial, paravertebral, and intraosseous placement on fresh frozen cadavers with Dr. Fritz, Dr. Seifert, and Dr. Kansagra. Exceptional education lectures were provided by Col Buckenmier, MD, and Stephanie Thomas, PharmD.




